## **On the Elections to the House of Representatives of the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus of the Fifth Convocation**

One more electoral campaign finished, and within its framework voters of our country cast their votes for deputies in the elections to the House of Representatives of the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus. The results of the elections were determined by the constituency election commissions and published in mass media.

According to the results 5 million 245 thousand 459 voters took part in the elections, and it constitutes 74.61 per cent of all voters mentioned in the lists of people eligible to vote.

In the first round 109 deputies were elected to the House of Representatives. In Gomel-Novobelitsky constituency No. 36 a deputy was not elected: in this constituency one deputy was nominated and he was not supported by a required number of voters.

This electoral campaign has become an indicator of the electoral legislation revised in 2010.

As to motivate political parties to become involved in the elections the Electoral Code of the Republic of Belarus was amended with a number of significant innovations that essentially simplified the process of nomination of deputies by political parties. As a result, the number of candidates nominated by the political parties increased by four times in comparison with the previous elections to the House of Representatives held in 2008. The number of registered candidates to deputies' offices nominated by political parties exceeded the similar indicator of the year 2008 by four times as well. It proves that in comparison with the previous electoral campaigns the parties were more active in nominating their candidates for deputies' offices as well as, first of all, that an effective legislative mechanism had been established, which eliminated quite strict approaches to registration of nominees to deputies.

Fixing the position of a member of the Central Commission with the right of a consultative vote, which was used by 7 political parties, also contributed to strengthening of the role and responsibility of political parties in the election process.

New provisions of the law have essentially reduced the number of grounds to reject registration of a candidate for a deputy's office. So, according to the updated edition of the Code some inaccuracies in information related to biography in the documents for nomination could not become a reason to reject registration as well as some inaccuracies in data about income and possessions, which were not of great significance. The way of presenting some articles related to the reasons for recognizing signatures as invalid, exclusion of individual signatures from verification and exclusion of the necessity to authorize signatures of members of the initiative groups in local executive and regulatory bodies, in the updated version of the Code ensured a possibility to a wider range of people nominated by way of collecting signatures to be registered as candidates for deputies' offices.

The total number of candidates registered in constituencies was equal to 375, the average indicator of the "competition" in these elections is 3.4 candidates per one deputy's mandate (in 2008 it was slightly lower, namely: 2.5).

The electoral legislation was also amended and modified in the issues of funding. The peculiarity of funding this electoral campaign was the following: the candidates for deputies' offices of the House of Representatives for the first time got a possibility to form their own election funds at account of voluntary donations by physical persons and legal entities. Nevertheless, only 86 nominees to deputies exercised the right to establish election funds with the majority of nominees (273) using the funds from the national budget as to publish propaganda printed materials.

The propaganda election campaign was held within the forms stipulated by the electoral legislation: by means of mass media, holding mass actions (meetings and sessions with citizens, rallies, pickets, etc.) and dissemination of electoral printed materials.

The additional right provided to nominees for deputies' offices and their authorized people to hold mass actions within the procedure, which stipulated notification thereof, was quite demanded: 220 notifications of holding 3, 885 mass actions were submitted to the local executive and regulatory bodies.

The right to free addresses on TV was exercised by 280 nominees to deputy, and as for the radio broadcasting – by 276 nominees.

For the first time the nominees for deputies' offices to the House of Representatives got an opportunity to take part in debates on television and radio. However, the new form of pre-electoral campaigning was used not by all candidates: the TV debates were held in 30 constituencies, and the radio debates – in 13 constituencies.

When holding some election actions there were some questions that required special interpretations and comments. In particular, individual candidates for deputies' offices, having been registered by the authorized people of other candidates (it is not prohibited by the Electoral Code), got an opportunity to take part in debates both in the capacity of nominees to deputy and in the capacity of proxies authorized by other candidates to participate in the debates. In this case the Central Commission took a resolution where it explained that authorized people with the status of a candidate for a deputy's office were not entitled to take part in the debates due to the fact that it could not ensure the principle of equal legal conditions of propaganda activities of candidates for deputies' offices to the House of Representatives.

The interaction of the Central Commission and the Supervisory Council for Control over Observation of Procedure and Rules of Holding Electoral Propaganda in Mass Media was filled with some new experience in the issue of free electoral propaganda addresses of the candidates containing calls to boycott the elections. The Central Commission approved of the position stated by the Supervisory Council, which stipulated that those statements of nominees to deputy having calls to refuse from participation in voting could not be considered to be election propaganda and respectively they could not be covered by the guarantees to candidates for deputies' offices, established by the law, to hold electoral campaigns in mass media free of charge.

On the eve of the early voting on September 15, 2012, there were congresses of the United Civil Party and the BPF Party held, where the decisions on nominating by the above-mentioned parties of candidates for deputies' offices (35 candidates from the United Civil Party and 30 – from the BPF Party) were cancelled. Therefore, the total number of candidates for the positions of deputies voted for on the election day – September 23, 2012 – was equal to 293 people.

Much interest was kept by observers to the elections to the House of Representatives. The monitoring of the elections was carried out by national and foreign (international) observers. Their total number was 31, 066. It is necessary to note that there were virtually no any serious critical notes from observers about the voting procedure and counting of votes addressed at electoral commissions.

According to the granted powers the Central Commission saw its mission in ensuring exercise of suffrage of citizens when holding the elections. For these purposes the Commission supported electoral commissions of all levels within legal, methodological and organization procedures. These ways of support included travels with the purpose of providing practical assistance in the locations, drafting methodological recommendations, written and oral consultations, seminars, trainings, workshops, etc. Special attention was paid to consideration of citizens' appeals and applications. The citizens, in the same way as it was observed during the previous elections, asked for comments and interpretations of some norms of the electoral legislation, individual electoral procedures; they gave various proposals for making the legislation perfect. The analysis of these appeals and applications also proves that some voters strive to solve some existing social and household problems using the pre-electoral framework. Some appeals from citizens submitted to the Central Commission were considered at the sittings of the Working group for preliminary consideration of complaints about violation of the electoral legislation; the group was established for the period of holding the elections for the first time.

In April 2012 the updated website of the Central Commission was launched on the Internet, and useful data, resolutions of the Commission, methodological materials, relevant information about all stages of the electoral campaign, about events, sittings held in the Central Commission were posted on it. The information portal of the Central Commission "Elections – 2012" provided everyone with an opportunity to watch online press-conferences held by the authorities of the Central Commission.

As it goes according to the tradition, on the election day the Central Commission Information Center worked in the Palace of the Republic. Representatives of mass media and foreign (international) observers received all relevant information about the running of voting, and on the following day after the elections they could get preliminary information about the results of the elections.

At the session of the Central Commission held on September 28, 2012, the results of the elections of deputies of the House of Representatives of the Republic of Belarus of the fifth convocation were established, registration of the elected deputies was carried out and the decision on calling the first session of the House of Representatives of the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus of the fifth convocation to be held on October 18, 2012 was taken.

Considering openness and transparency as the most important and necessary condition of its activity, the Central Commission in this book provides the detailed statistical data about the running and results of the elections of deputies of the House of Representatives of the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus of the fifth convocation.

**Excerpts from Statement  
of the Chairwoman of the Central Commission of the Republic of Belarus  
on Elections and Holding Republican Referenda L.M. Ermoshina  
at the First Sitting of the House of Representatives of the National Assembly  
of the Republic of Belarus of the Fifth Convocation**

On Composition:

– 21 deputies of the House of Representatives of the previous convocation will continue their activities in the House of Representatives of the new convocation. At the same time, renewal of the legislative body by over three fourth will serve a good motive for further improvement of the legislative activities.

Dignified representative of the Belarusian nation were elected to the Parliament. 47 deputies are awarded orders and medals, 7 deputies have honorable titles, 17 deputies have academic degrees or titles.

There are 29 women in the total number of deputies of the House of Representatives.

Representatives of three political parties received their deputies' mandates: the Communist Party of Belarus is represented by three deputies, the Belarusian Agrarian Party and the Republican Party of Labor and Justice are represented by one deputy each. 63 deputies are members of the Republican Public Association "Belaya Rus".

Social status of the deputies varies. 34 per cent are executives of organizations in various fields. Voters expressed much trust to executives of local representative, executive and regulatory bodies: there are 16 of them among deputies.

There are lawyers, economists, teachers, doctors, engineers, agricultural specialists, military officers as well as representatives of other qualifications and occupations among deputies. In the composition there is a winner of the Olympic Games, world and European championships.

A high educational and professional level of the elected deputies allows to say with confidence that the House of Representatives of the new convocation is able to competently and duly perform its duties and exercise powers as provided by the Constitution of the Republic of Belarus.

**Edict of the President of the Republic of Belarus**  
**June 18, 2012 No. 276**

On Fixing Elections to the House of Representatives  
of the National Assemble of the Republic of Belarus  
of the Fifth Convocation

According to clause 2 of Article 84 of the Constitution of the Republic of Belarus I, therewith, establish the following:

1. To fix elections to the House of Representatives of the National assembly of the Republic of Belarus of the fifth convocation on September 23, 2012.

2. The Central Commission of the Republic of Belarus on Elections and Holding Republican referenda shall, according to its powers, organize holding the elections to the House of Representatives of the National assembly of the Republic of Belarus and shall supervise due execution of the legislation on elections.

3. State bodies, other organizations shall ensure execution within the terms as established in the Electoral Code of the Republic of Belarus, of organizational actions within their competence on preparing and holding the elections to the House of Representatives of the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus.

4. The Council of Ministers of the Republic of Belarus shall ensure funding of expenses for preparing and holding the elections to the House of Representatives of the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus within the funds provided for these purposes in the national budget.

5. This Edict shall enter into force since the day of its official publication.
